



Year: 5 Spring: 2

Geography

To learn about the Global Goals and their importance in the world. They will investigate how single use plastics are damaging our oceans and waterways and how we can move to being single-use-plastic free.

We will discuss how both aid and trade have a place in our world today and what the difference is between migrants and refugees.

The children will create a presentation to explain Global Goals to their peers

Science

Children will compare and group together everyday materials based on their properties, including hardness, solubility, transparency, conductivity and response to magnets. They will use their knowledge of solid, liquid and gas to decide how mixtures might be separated.

Children will plan and carry out their own fair tests to investigate different methods of separation

Global Citizen



The children understand the Global Goals and our impact on the world.

Outcome: The children will understand that they can make a change which will improve our world in the long term.

English

One Plastic Bag by Miranda Paul. The children will learn the skills they need for persuasive writing, including relative clauses, hyperbole and degrees of possibility.

Pupils will write a formal letter to government using persuasive writing.

Oranges in No Man's Land by Elizabeth Laird. Whilst reading this book the children will learn the skills needed to rewrite part of the story.

The children will read and develop an understanding of this book and then re-write a section of it from a different perspective.

DT

Cooking and nutrition.

Children will learn about the origins of meat; beef comes from cows reared on farms. We will discuss how and why recipes can be adapted to suit nutritional needs and dietary requirements, whilst understanding what these needs mean.

We will investigate the nutritional information found on food packaging, what it tells us and how we can use it to help us to stay healthy. We'll learn how coloured chopping boards can prevent cross-contamination, whilst practising our food preparation skills.

The children will learn how to prepare and cook a bolognese sauce.
